The City Council of the City of Brady, Texas met in a Regular Meeting on Tuesday, July 21, 2015 at 6:00p.m. at the Ed Davenport Civic Center, 200 Country Club Rd, Brady, Texas with Mayor Anthony Groves presiding. Council members present were Latricia Doyal, Marilyn Gendusa, Shelly Perkins, Kathy Gloria, and Jack Turk. 1. CALL TO ORDER, ROLL CALL & CERTIFICATION OF A QUORUM

Mayor Groves called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m. Roll was then called for Council and a quorum was certified.

Discussion, consideration, and possible action regarding second reading of Ordinance 1174 to amend Zoning Ordinance 933, Section 28.10 (Zoning Use Chart) to allow Alcoholic Beverage Liquor by the Drink as a Specific Use Provision (SUP) in the Brady Lake Recreational District (BLR), Retail District (R), Central Business District (CBD), and Commercial District (C). Peter Lamont presented to council. Council Member Gendusa made motion to approve. Seconded by Council Member Turk. All Council Members voted "aye" and none "no". Motion carried.
- B. Discussion, consideration, and possible action regarding second reading of Ordinance 1175 to re-zone from Single-Family Residential (SF-5) to Industrial District (I) as requested by Premier Silica on property located on the East side of Oglebay Norton Drive, 16.62 acres out of the H. & T.C. Railroad Company Survey, Abstract No. 1483 and consisting of all of Blocks 1 to 6 of Dutton's 1st Addition. Peter Lamont presented to council. Council Member Turk made motion to approve. Seconded by Council Member Gendusa. All Council Members voted "aye" and none "no". Motion carried.

- C. Discussion, consideration, and possible action regarding second reading of Ordinance 1176 for a Specific Use Provision (SUP) in the Central Business District (CBD) as requested by Rick Althof for property located at 109 North Church for the purpose of a restaurant/sports bar. Peter Lamont presented to council. Council Member Gendusa made motion to approve. Seconded by Council Member Gloria. All Council Members voted “aye” and none “no”. Motion carried.
- D. Discussion, consideration, and possible action regarding revised Resolution 2015-028R and Agreement with the BEDC to use ¼ cent sales tax to fund the Civic Center Renovation and Expansion Project, authorized by the voters in May 2009 (not to exceed \$1,871,000. Peter Lamont presented to council. Mayor Groves commented. Gary Ray questioned council about final decision. Staff reported that bidding is now underway and bids will be opened August 12. Council Member Gloria made motion to approve. Seconded by Council Member Gendusa. All Council Members voted “aye” and none “no”. Motion carried.
