The City Council of the City of Brady, Texas met in a Regular Meeting on Tuesday, July 5, 2016, at 6:00pm at the City of Brady Service Center located at 1405 N. Bridge Street, Brady, Texas with Mayor Anthony Groves presiding. Council Members present were Marilyn Gendusa, Shelly Perkins, Kathy Gloria, Jane Huffman and James Griffin. City staff present were City Manager Kim Lenoir, Finance Director Lisa Remini, City Attorney Shannon Kackley, Director of Public Works Steven Miller, Director of Community Services Peter Lamont, City Secretary Tina Keys, and Police Chief Steve Thomas. Others in attendance were Charlotte and John Harper, Lynn Farris, James Stewart, Trooper Smith and Coby Gee.

**1. CALL TO ORDER, ROLL CALL & CERTIFICATION OF A QUORUM**

Mayor Groves called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Roll was then called for Council and a quorum was certified.

**2. INVOCATION & PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

Council Member Gendusa gave the invocation, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

**3. APPROVAL OF AUDIT BOARD**

Council Member Gendusa moved to approve the audit board. Motion was seconded by Council Member Griffin. All Council Members voted "aye" and none "nay". Motion carried in a 5-0 vote.

**4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES for June 21, 2016**

Council Member Gendusa moved to approve the minutes. Motion was seconded by Council Member Griffin. All Council Members voted "aye" and none "nay". Motion carried in a 5-0 vote.

**5. PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Shelly Perkins said she was asked by residents to inquire on their behalf about City Lake Lot Leases in Davee and Dodge Heights. She stated citizens are wanting to pay their annual lease payments but were told they can't pay them yet. She requested a status update. City Manager Lenoir replied that the property is being resurveyed. Perkins said the "billing girls are telling people they don't know when they will be billed" and Perkins asked for a deadline. Lenoir reiterated we are waiting on surveyor and the re-platting process, likely another 6 months. Perkins suggested that we notify those citizens of the status.

Charlotte Harper shared that on May 23<sup>rd</sup>, she suffered a major seizure. She expressed gratitude to EMS crew that responded and drove her to San Angelo, as helicopter service were not available due to inclement weather. Chief Daniel met ambulance in Eden and rode to San Angelo. They saved her life. Specifically she thanked Lynne White, Jaron Shahan, David Pegues, Priscilla Campbell, and Lyle Daniel. She recognized and thanked all the caring individuals of the Brady EMS, reminding Brady how blessed we are to have this service.

**7. INDIVIDUAL CONCERNS**

- A. Discussion, consideration, and possible action regarding Resolution 2016-033 authorizing the City Manager to sign the Amendment for Consulting Services with Freese and Nichols, Inc. for Phase II – Preliminary Engineering Design Services, TPDES Permitting and Environmental Assessment for WWTP Replacement Project to include basic services of Permitting, environmental and preliminary engineering design, and special services of surveying and geotechnical investigation. The fee for basic services equals \$721,369.00 and

special services equals \$37,016.00 for a total fee basis of \$758,385.00. Steve Miller presented to Council. After discussion amongst counsel members, Council Member Gloria moved to approve Resolution 2016-033. The motion was seconded by Council Member Perkins. All council members voted "aye" and none "nay". Motion carried in a 5-0.

- B. Discussion, consideration and possible action regarding first reading of Ordinance 1198 of the City of Brady, Texas, establishing a Curfew for Minors (under 17 years of age, 11:00pm until 6:00am Sunday - Thursday and 12:01am to 6:00am Fridays and Saturdays). Council Member Perkins commented on the need to renumber page 1 of 5, add Number 2 and renumber for a total of 10 sections and on page 5 of 5, section 11, "or its caption" – thinks the caption is not sufficient. Mayor Groves stated charter requires you publish the caption or the whole ordinance. Council Member Perkins would like more than the caption published. Mayor Groves clarified you can add more than just the caption. We can direct staff to add other clarification. Council Member Gendusa suggested we put the whole 5 pages on the website and Council Member Gloria would like to inform our citizens in the news media to let the people know why the ordinance is important for our children's safety. Chief Thomas would also like to educate the public and is committed to that. Council Member Gendusa moved to approve the first reading of Ordinance 1198. The motion was seconded by Council Member Griffin. Four Council Members voted "aye" and one "nay" with Council Member Huffman voting against. Motion carried in a 4-1 vote.
- C. Discussion consideration and possible action to fill vacancies, expired terms and alternates on Brady Economic Development Corporation (BEDC), Board of Adjustments / Zoning Board of Adjustments (BOA/ZBA), Airport Advisory, Charter Commission, and Planning & Zoning Commission (P&Z). Mayor Groves commented there is not an available spot on the board applied for the one candidate and the other candidate is not qualified since he lives in the county but would like to invite Dale Scott to participate in meetings until we look at our handbook and change the rules. Kim Lenoir commented that Dale Scott lives in Mason County, but he does own a business in town. We could change in the Board Handbook, to reflect if a candidate has a business in the city, they would qualify.
- D. Discussion regarding City Council meeting procedures and process. Mayor asked for opinions on how the meeting went – most were thumbs up. Council Member Perkins would like to point out in Ordinance 1126, Section 1.603, E. Public Participation, Item 8 about stopping a citizen who makes a "verbal assault" comment, she would like to see that done by the Mayor, if necessary. Mayor agreed he would be prepared to do so.



Mayor opened public hearing at 6:07 p.m. Peter Lamont presented to Council and announced that Planning & Zoning had voted to recommend. Several council members and some citizens had questions and comments. Closed public hearing on Dangerous Premises at 6:40 p.m.
- C. Public Hearing to receive comments for or against an amendment to the City of Brady Zoning Ordinance 933 for a Cargo/Shipping Container Ordinance. Mayor opened public hearing at 6:40 p.m. Peter Lamont presented to Council. Comments were made by Council and public. Closed public hearing on Cargo/Shipping Container Ordinance at 7:03 p.m.
- D. Public Hearing to receive comments for or against a zoning change from Office (O) District to Commercial (C) District for property located 600 & 606 South Bridge Street, Block 133, Lots 4 & 5 of the Luhr Addition, as requested by Jay May. Mayor opened public hearing at 7:03pm. Peter Lamont presented to Council. Council

Member Perkins questioned the June 29 map and July 11 map and commented that the drawings are not consistent. Lamont clarified that the July 11 map is correct. Closed public hearing on zoning changes at 7:09 p.m.

## 7. INDIVIDUAL CONCERNS

- A. Discussion, consideration, and possible action regarding first reading of **Ordinance 1199** of the City of Brady, Texas, amendment to the City of Brady Zoning Ordinance 933 for an Overlay District for Infill Development Ordinance, as recommended by P&Z Commission on July 12, 2016. Peter Lamont presented to Council. Council Member Gendusa moved to approve first reading of Ordinance 1199. The motion was seconded by Council Member Griffin. All council members voted "aye" and none "nay". Motion carried in a 5-0 vote.
- B. Discussion, consideration and possible action regarding first reading of **Ordinance 1200** of the City of Brady, Texas, amendment to the City of Brady Code of Ordinances, Article 3.200, Dangerous Premises on substandard buildings, as recommended by P&Z Commission on July 12, 2016. Peter Lamont presented to Council. Council Member Perkins is concerned that we have no written procedures. Council Member Griffin thinks it needs to be made clear that structures are to be completely uninhabitable for health and safety. Need to change lack of hot water to lack of running water. Mayor Groves affirmed that if a City Official sees something that is unsafe or dangerous, this gives him the authority to do something. Council Member Gloria agrees we have a sense of responsibility to keep our citizens safe, but we need to have something in place to help these people. City Manager Lenoir explained that the City does refer people, on a regular basis, to organizations who can help. Council Member Perkins moved to approve first reading of Ordinance 1200 as amended. There was no second. The motion failed. No action taken.
- C. Mayor Groves asked regarding page 26, item B2 – who determines what is obscene, indecent or immoral? Lamont answered it used to be up to the community. Attorney Shannon Kackley also commented that Council could make that determination and said there are guidelines to go by. Lamont will add “advertisement flags” to clear-up that we are not regulating US Flag or Texas Flag. Council Member Perkins added it also needs to be added to #11 on page 28 also. Council Member Gloria asked about signs already in place and wanted to know if they be inspected, permitted or what. Lamont said we will have to look at them on an individual basis. 

### **1. CALL TO ORDER, ROLL CALL & CERTIFICATION OF A QUORUM**

Mayor Groves called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Council quorum was certified.

Council Member Gendusa gave the invocation, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

### **3. PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Fernando Nandin, speaking on behalf of the Mexican Colony, they do not want the annexation.

Don Taylor – the barber – supports demolition of 1205 N. Walnut – he lives behind this property for 20 years. Has seen so many changes in that property. The house is falling down. It's a bad health problem. It's a bad situation and a fire hazard. Is very concerned about the problem. It is devaluating the property in the area.

Jason Jacoby – regarding annexation. Asking Council to think through decisions that need to be made. Thanked Council for the work they do. Knows it's not an easy job.

County Judge Danny Neal – reminded audience about early 2000 meeting a professional firm came in to bring ordinances up to 2000s from early 70's. He is encouraged the City is considering annexation. Watched small communities grow. Residential development grew around schools, water resources, golf courses. Thought back then that Brady hasn't grown since he left for college. It's going to grow. If you look at some of the things going on, it is going to grow. And annexation is the first step in implementing that growth. Someone from Coleman had mentioned that cities can delay taxation on an annex area until they are better prepared to deliver the services. Asks the public's patience and asking them to look at what the City will look at years down the road.

Tonya Rankin – husband's family has property in area 1. They strongly object to annexation. They have no intentions of subdividing or developing. Doesn't feel there will be any benefit to the City. Feels draft non-annexation agreement mainly benefits the City and would like to develop an agreement that is mutually beneficial.

Mike Whitworth – questioned why certified letters were not sent – clarification was given by the attorney. Also asked how we were informed that the notice of public hearing was on website. City Manager Lenoir said we have written certification. Also questioned the service plan costs. Asked about the availability to view the annexation ordinance and was informed, again, that it will be done in December. Mentioned the charter, article 2, boundaries of

the City, if somebody wants to be annexed.

Mayor Groves called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m. Roll was then called for Council and a quorum was certified.

**2. INVOCATION & PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

Council Member Gendusa gave the invocation, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

**3. PUBLIC COMMENTS**

- A. Staff presentation of Proposed Annexations. Kim Lenoir presented to Council and citizens.
- B. Staff presentation of Proposed Service Plans for Annexations 1, 2, 3 and 4. Steven Miller presented.
- C. Public Hearing for comments FOR or AGAINST proposed annexations on the NW and West City Limit "holes" opened at 6:42 p.m.

Al Machen and Eddie Wilson on behalf of HOT Bible Camp, Church of Christ. Not sure where they fall on the boundary line. Lenoir said boundary line cut through their property. Lenoir will recommend to council to NOT cut into their property. The ordinances are adopted by metes and bounds. Staff recommendation will not to include Bible Camp. Mayor Groves asked what the concerns are. Mr. Machen said it's a wilderness camp and would like it to not be in the city limits. There is no taxes generated. The directors voted not to be annexed if possible.

Fernando Nandin on behalf of the Mexican Colony. They have to pay \$60 an hour for police protection during an event. People in the Mexican Colony are concerned about park they paid for and built. They are paying to remove tires, approximately \$6,000 that has been donated. Concern is where will the revenue be used. They do not see they will receive any benefit. They do not wish to be annexed.

Barry Deans owns property that was annexed in 1984. Has been trying to get water to the property since 1984 but the City won't put services out there. People who were annexed years ago are still waiting for services.

Jerry Kirkland family, Tract 1, Fisher Miller Tract, across from First Baptist Church is protesting annexation.

They do agriculture, farming and want to maintain that status. Does not want to fall under City Code regulations. Thinks annexation should be on a case by case basis. They are opposed to annexation.

Tonya Rankin for the Rankin Family objected annexation. Land belongs to her parents and is said to inherit the land where Sydnie lives. They have an ag exemption on the property. They don't feel that annexing that land will help the City grow. Doesn't feel neighbors will want to subdivide either. They hope Council votes against it.

Kelly Elliott believes the City should take care of what they have before taking on more. Feels like the motivation is wrapped around the budget. Has issues with lack of transparency. There are several different stories. Doesn't think boundary lines should have ever been changed. Never received letter. Is concerned about the City having control. Doesn't feel she has been informed of the process.

Shelly Perkins left the meeting at 7:17pm.

Alan Felts doesn't want to have to ask permission to live as he has been living the past 13 years. But the decision has already been made. Believes he is already paying City tax with distribution charges.

Deanna Byrd. Family has property 70-80 years. Only benefit would be having a dog catcher. They didn't vote in Council since they aren't in the City. Has concerns about having to abide by building codes. The Byrds are against annexation.

Jason Jacoby. Asked Council if they have seen service plan. None have. Council doesn't even know what it is going to cost. He hasn't seen service plan and/or a development plan. Was told he would not receive sewer services. Knows there are other means to determine boundary lines. Who is paying for the cost of annexation? Is the city annexing more than 10% of the incorporated area? Answer no. When will we see a service plan? Lenoir answered we have them tonight. Wants to know what paving restrictions are. Would like to see annexation on an as needed basis. Will annexation cause a reduction in emergency services for existing city citizens?

Mackey Ranne with Davenport Trucking. Reasons he believes the City should not annex. Hasn't heard anybody who wants to be annexed. What is the cost of the City to annex Bailey Metals and the tires? You have an obligation to clean up. The City has enough on its plate already taking care of areas that are not under the City's control. Thinks we should concentrate on current commitments. Only things they will get out of annexation is taxation and regulation.

Mike Whitworth owns property off of Peach St. Purchased that property to bring trailers, livestock, etc. Does not have enough property to have agricultural exemption. Section 43.0561 – Section C – publishing of notice in newspaper and on website.

Heath McBride owns property in Area 4. They are opposed to the annexation. It doesn't really make sense. It's not going to fix anything. Nobody wants it.

Marjorie Hunter owns the property on Park Street. House is City, land is in the County. Doesn't have City services. Wants to be left alone.

Kenneth Jeffreys owns most of Area 3. Signed non-annexation development agreement. Asking Council to honor non-annexation agreement.

Jason Jacoby would like to see 43056 and 43053, inventory of service and facilities that are encompassed in the annexation.

Fernando Nandin has a church in the Mexican Colony. He follows the rules and filed for a 501c3. County appraiser does not honor that. It will be an added tax burden to the church.

Zane Brandenburger the property is not in the name of the church it is in Mr Nandin's personal name. That is why he isn't tax exempt. He is in disagreement of the 1906 line and feels he can prove that. He would ask us to go back and use the grey dotted lines on all the maps.

Tonya Rankin said the property lines were changed according to the 1906 survey and there was nothing they could do. Received a letter saying a survey was done but there was no survey done. Would like to know the results of the survey.

Jeff Bedwell you are leaving future city staff to take care of this situation. Thinks we need to focus on what we are doing now.

Mike Whitworth – said the MCCAD can print a map of the City on the historical land.

Gloria Constancia is opposed to annexation.

Closed public hearing at 8:17pm.


