Discussion, consideration and possible action regarding second and final reading of **Ordinance 1238** of the City of Brady, Texas, to amend FY 2018 Budget transferring unfinished projects FY2017 to FY2018 Budget, and adding new requests. Lisa Remini presented. Council Member Sutton moved to approve the second and final reading of **Ordinance 1236**. Seconded by Council Member Perkins. All Council Members, voted "aye" and none voted "nay". Motion carried in a 4 - 0 vote.
- B. Discussion, consideration and possible action regarding the second and final reading of **Ordinance 1237** to amend Article 2 of the City of Brady Municipal Code of Ordinances to establish fencing requirements and to clarify rules (Not including Article 2.400 Keeping Livestock and Exotic Animals. Kim Lenoir Presented. Council member Perkins moved to approve the second and final reading of **Ordinance 1237**. Seconded by Council Member Garza. All Council Members voted "aye" and none "nay". Motion carried in a 4 – 0 vote.
- C. Discussion, consideration and possible action regarding **Demolition Order 2018-15** in accordance with the Code of Ordinances Section 3.207 to authorize demolition of dilapidated structure(s) at 1308 North College Street in the Crothers Subdivision, Block 31, Lot 5 (Published 10-5-17 / Public Hearing held 10-17-2017). Peter Lamont presented. There was discussion between Council, police and the owner. Lamont informed Owner she has 90 days to make improvements and bring back timeline to Council before abatement order is issued. Council Member Garza moved to extend timeline to next council meeting on November 21, 2017. Seconded by Council Member Griffin. Two Council Members voted "aye" and two Council Members, Perkins and Sutton voted "nay". Mayor broke tie with an "aye" vote. Motion carried with a 3 – 2 vote.
- D. Discussion, consideration, and possible action regarding **Demolition Order 2016-10** in accordance with the Code of Ordinances Section 3.207 to authorize demolition of dilapidated structure(s) at 502 West 2nd Street in the Luhr Subdivision, Block 97, Lot 3, Brady, Texas (Published 7-3-17 / Public Hearing held 7-18-17). Council Member Sutton moved to approve Demolition Order 2016-10. Seconded by Council Member Garza. Motion carried in a 4 – 0 vote.
- E. Discussion, consideration and possible action regarding acceptance of the McCulloch County/Brady Chamber of Commerce Annual Tourism Report, as required by Resolution 2014-030 and contract agreement. Peter Lamont presented and asked Council to review for next meeting. Council Member Perkins moved to move item to next meeting. Seconded by Council Member Sutton. Motion carried in a 4 – 0 vote.
- F. Discussion, consideration, and possible action regarding **Resolution 2017-036** renaming Stanburn Neighborhood Park in compliance with the City of Brady Parks and Recreational Facilities Naming Policy, to Lt. Daniel R. Conway Park, adopted by Fairmount Santrol, and accepting \$50,000 donation to replace playground equipment, as well as plans to renovate the other park facilities and plant new trees. Council Member Perkins found out that Stanburn is the name of the subdivision and was created by family names of Stanton and Burns. They are not objecting to renaming park, but Perkins was dismayed that no one bothered to find out where the name came from. Perkins would also like more information on Lt. Conway. Council Member Griffin moved to approve Resolution 2017-036. Seconded by Council Member Garza. All Council Members voted "aye" and none "nay". Motion carried in a 4 – 0 vote.
- G. Discussion, consideration, and possible action regarding 10-17-2017 Public Comments from Michael Whitworth, 1300 Block of Peach Street, McCulloch County resident concerning drainage easement/fence permit/replat proposal at 1110 W. 11th Street; animal control complaint at Joe Sanchez, 700 S. Elm Street; temporary utility connection policies for contractors; and process of general enforcement of existing ordinances. Peter Lamont presented and outlined standard Code Enforcement procedures and timelines. John Henry with KSA was in attendance and has reviewed the drainage easement issue and is recommending

the drainage easement be released. There is no need for the easement. Steve Thomas addressed animal control issue and discussed the process for animal control. Regarding the Sanchez case, there were several verbal warnings given and Animal Control was told animals would be removed, and that did happen. They were removed. But the animals were brought back to the property. The issue WAS addressed and will continue to be monitored. Lisa Remini discussed temporary utility connections. The gentleman in question wanted service at an address in which he did not have legal ownership. The owner must give permission to an individual to be on the property doing work to turn on utilities. Council Member Griffin brought up a conversation with a citizen in which they were going to have to pay a large amount to get utilities turned on. Remini explained the deposit requirements, per ordinance, and that Council can change the ordinance if they choose. Whitworth said the contractor was told the owner would have to appear in person to sign. City practice is to allow other options to those who cannot come into City Hall. Council Member Perkins would like to look at the existing policy.

**AGREEMENT FOR THE TEMPORARY CLOSURE
OF STATE RIGHT OF WAY**

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between the State of Texas, acting by and through the Texas Department of Transportation, hereinafter called the "State," and the City of Brady, a municipal corporation, acting by and through its duly authorized officers, hereinafter called the "local government."

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the State owns and operates a system of highways for public use and benefit, including The City of Brady, in McCulloch, County; and

WHEREAS, the local government has requested the temporary closure of US Hwy 87 from Hwy 190 to Court House Square for the purpose of CHRISTMAS IN THE HEART LIGHTED PARADE, from 6:00PM to 7:00PM as described in the attached "Exhibit A," hereinafter identified as the "Event;" and

WHEREAS, the Event will be located within the local government's incorporated area; and

WHEREAS, the State, in recognition of the public purpose of the Event, wishes to cooperate with the City so long as the safety and convenience of the traveling public is ensured and that the closure of the State's right of way will be performed within the State's requirements; and

WHEREAS, on the _____ day of _____, 20____, the _____ City Council passed Resolution / Ordinance No. _____, attached hereto and identified as "Exhibit B," establishing that the Event serves a public purpose and authorizing the local government to enter into this agreement with the State; and

WHEREAS, 43 TAC, Section 22.12 establishes the rules and procedures for the temporary closure of a segment of the State highway system; and

WHEREAS, this agreement has been developed in accordance with the rules and procedures of 43 TAC, Section 22.12;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants and agreements of the parties hereto, to be by them respectively kept and performed as hereinafter set forth, it is agreed as follows:

A G R E E M E N T

Article 1. CONTRACT PERIOD

This agreement becomes effective upon final execution by the State and shall terminate upon completion of the Event or unless terminated or modified as hereinafter provided.

allowance for emergency vehicle travel and adequate access for abutting property owners during construction and closure of the highway facility. These allowances and accesses will be included in the local government's traffic control plan.

H. The local government will avoid or minimize damage, and will, at its own expense, restore or repair damage occurring outside the State's right of way and restore or repair the State's right of way, including, but not limited to, roadway and drainage structures, signs, overhead signs, pavement markings, traffic signals, power poles and pavement, etc. to a condition equal to that existing before the closure, and, to the extent practicable, restore the natural and cultural environment in accordance with federal and state law, including landscape and historical features.

Article 4. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

Upon completion or termination of this agreement, all documents prepared by the local government will remain the property of the local government. All data prepared under this agreement shall be made available to the State without restriction or limitation on their further use. At the request of the State, the Local Government shall submit any information required by the State in the format directed by the State.

Article 5. TERMINATION

A. This agreement may be terminated by any of the following conditions:

- (1) By mutual written agreement and consent of both parties.
- (2) By the State upon determination that use of the State's right of way is not feasible or is not in the best interest of the State and the traveling public.
- (3) By either party, upon the failure of the other party to fulfill the obligations as set forth herein.
- (4) By satisfactory completion of all services and obligations as set forth herein.

B. The termination of this agreement shall extinguish all rights, duties, obligations, and liabilities of the State and local government under this agreement. If the potential termination of this agreement is due to the failure of the local government to fulfill its contractual obligations as set forth herein, the State will notify the local government that possible breach of contract has occurred. The local government must remedy the breach as outlined by the State within ten (10) days from receipt of the State's notification. In the event the local government does not remedy the breach to the satisfaction of the State, the local government shall be liable to the State for the costs of remedying the breach and any additional costs occasioned by the State.

Article 6. DISPUTES

Should disputes arise as to the parties' responsibilities or additional work under this agreement, the State's decision shall be final and binding.

Article 7. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES

The State and the Local Government agree that neither party is an agent, servant, or employee of the other party and each party agrees it is responsible for its individual acts and deeds as well as the acts and deeds of its contractors, employees, representatives, and agents.

Article 8. INSURANCE

A. Prior to beginning any work upon the State's right of way, the local government and/or its contractors shall furnish to the State a completed "Certificate of Insurance" (TxDOT Form 1560, latest edition) and shall maintain the insurance in full force and effect during the period



Chronic Code Complaints

901 Bombay – A citation was issued to the occupant on 08/30/2017 and he is scheduled to be in court on November 22nd.

1402/1404 S High – A citation was issued to the owner and occupant on 08/30/2017, went to court and received a fine after the property was cleaned up. The case has been closed.

204/206 S Walnut – The property now has utilities so they can get the house in order. The trailer was still there but they are still cleaning on the property according to the owner.

6th and S Blackburn – Owner cannot be found.

502 W 2nd – Demolition Order #2016-10 was finally issued for property owner to demolish.

201 W 6th – Demolition Order 2018-16 was issued for property owner to demolish this property. Wendy Rubio has said that they were already planning on demolishing the property but they wanted the wood. She has been informed that if she does not demolish the house by January 15, 2018, the city will demolish.

1403 S College – The property owner has been issued a violation notice. Property taxes are delinquent for 2016. The property is a nuisance since no one really takes care of the property but it is not dilapidated.

1410 S College – The property real estate company still has not abated the violations. Attempts have been made to contact him but no response yet.

801 North Grant – The property owner was finally in court in October. He was given 60 days to abate the violations and will be back on the court docket in December.

1905 South Cypress – The violations have been abated. Case has been closed.
