Water CIP Summary

- Over 6.4 miles of new water transmission line proposed (varies from 20-inch to 12-inch)
- Over 3 miles of water distribution line replacement (varies from 6-inch to 2-inch)
- 600,000 Gallons of new elevated storage tanks
- New 3 MGD Radionuclide Reduction Groundwater Treatment Plant
- Surface WTP Renovations, 3 MGD
- Groundwater Well Site Renovations
- Over \$26 million in Capital Improvements!



Current Status

- Radionuclide Reduction Treatment
 - **Process design is complete**, finishing coordination with structural, electrical and architectural design
- Surface WTP
 - **Process design is complete**, finishing coordination with structural, electrical and architectural design
- Water Transmission Lines
 - **Design is 80% complete**, finalizing remaining outstanding easements
- Elevated and Ground Storage
 - **Design is complete**, finishing coordination with FAA for new Airport EST
- Easements
 - **Major easements have been acquired**, finishing last remaining easements near Well 5 to optimize transmission line design
- Environmental
 - Environmental clearance will be updated once outstanding easements have been finalized


What Happened?

- State Legislature did not approve additional EDAP Program Funding
- State Legislature did approve release of the remaining EDAP Funds \$52 million BUT...
- Issuance of the remaining \$52 million must be delayed until the next fiscal year to avoid the State incurring any costs for the upcoming fiscal year

- **Is our water safe?**
 - Yes, our water is safe to drink!
 - However, the EPA is concerned about the potential of increasing cancer risks through drinking water with elevated levels of radionuclides over a lifetime, which is why we are working to reduce radionuclide levels in our drinking water.
- **What are radionuclides?**
 - Radionuclides are naturally occurring radioactive materials found underground – not related in any way to nuclear power plants or nuclear weapons!
- **How did EPA come up with its 5 picoCuries per liter (pCi/L) limit for Combined Radium?**
 - The lowest measurable level for Combined Radium was 5 pCi/L in 1976.
 - By 1991, studies showed that a more appropriate limit might be 20-30 pCi/L (in which case the City would be in compliance). Unfortunately, the EPA's Safe Drinking Water Rule has a "non-backsliding" clause, which restricts the EPA's ability to "relax" limits once established.
- **How do you resolve the radionuclide problem?**
 - We can treat the groundwater directly to reduce radionuclides, we can blend with a low radionuclide level supply, or replace the groundwater supply altogether.
 - The City's surface water supply cannot replace the groundwater supply on a continual basis.
- **What efforts has the City made in the past to address radionuclides in the groundwater?**
 - The City has developed additional wells, allowing the City to focus on using wells with the lowest radionuclide levels to meet daily water demands.
 - The City previously completed a blending project, but it was ultimately unsuccessful.
- **What are we doing about the radionuclides now?**
 - The City hired eHT to determine appropriate improvements to regain compliance.
 - Process design for treatment, storage and transmission improvements are complete, we are in the final stages of finalizing structural and electrical component design.
- **When will we start construction?**
 - The City is eligible for up to 85% grant in this project, at a savings of over \$9 million!
 - Start of construction is delayed due to waiting for Economically Distressed Areas Program (EDAP) funding from the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB), release of EDAP funding was delayed by the Texas Legislature during the 2017 legislative session.
- **Even if we reduce radionuclides now, is there risk from radionuclides in the water pipes?**
 - Radionuclides can "drop out" of water when scale forms on the surface of pipes. Similar to concerns in the media regarding lead and copper exposure, one critical method to protect water quality is to ensure that the drinking water produced is "slightly scale forming" to always maintain a protective layer on the surface of the piping. This approach will prevent radionuclides from re-entering the drinking water until sufficient funds are available to replace water piping.

CITY MANAGER APPROVAL:			
SUMMARY: On August 27, Council Member Garza requested a change in the Animal Control Ordinance to restrict livestock (goats, sheep, horses) from the city limits. He had received numerous complaints from citizens about odors, flies and maintenance of the grounds. The City Council discussed concerns with the Animal Control Officer and directed staff to bring a revised ordinance for City Council to consider. Staff and Council Members reviewed and discussed draft changes at a Work Session on September 19. Changes include restricting livestock, establishing fence requirement for all animals, allowance for 4-H and FFA animals to be kept in residential areas, and several grammar corrections.			
December 19 Work Session, City Council Members continued the review and adding to the definitions and changed rules for keeping livestock in the city.			
January 3, City Council approved the first reading with several amendments.

ORDINANCE 1243

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRADY, TEXAS AMENDING MUNICIPAL CODE OF ORDINANCES ARTICLE 2 ANIMAL CONTROL TO ESTABLISH DEFINITIONS AND CLARIFYING RULES FOR LIVESTOCK AND EXOTICS;

WHEREAS, in review of the Municipal Code of Ordinances, Chapter 2, Animal Control, it has become apparent that the Ordinance should more clearly define issues dealing with all animals within the City limits of the City of Brady; and

WHEREAS, changes to the City of Brady Municipal Code of Ordinances must be done by a new Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Brady has determined that it is in the best interests of the general public and residents of Brady to approve the proposed changes to the City of Brady Animal Control Ordinance, Section 2.101 Definitions and Article 2.400 Keeping Livestock and Exotic Animals.

The City Council of the City of Brady, Texas, hereby amends Chapter 2, Animal Control of the Municipal Code of Ordinances, Article 2.400 Keeping Livestock and Exotic Animals and Section 2.101 Definitions; see Exhibit A as attached.

EXHIBIT A
ARTICLE 2.100 IN GENERAL

Sec. 2.101 Definitions

As used in this chapter the following terms mean:

4-H/FFA Animal. A 4-H/FFA animal is any animal under the control of an authorized 4-H or FFA program.

Animal. Any living creature except human beings, and including (without limiting the generality thereof) animals, birds, reptiles and fish, except the word "animal" shall mean only a mammal when referring specifically to the control of rabies.

Animal Control Authority or Animal Control Officer. The city animal control officer, or his or her designee, with authority over the city limits within which the dog, cat or animal is kept.

Animal Control Center or Center. Facility in which the division of animal and rabies control is housed.

Bite. An abrasion, scratch, puncture, tear or piercing of the skin actually or suspected of being caused by the mouth of any animal.

Breeder. Any person licensed by the city to keep, harbor, breed and/or raise in excess of four (4) dogs or four (4) cats, six (6) months of age or older, on any premises used or zoned for residential purposes and less than two acres in area.

Collar. A band, chain, harness or other suitable device worn around the neck of an animal to which a current rabies vaccination tag can be affixed.

Current Vaccination. Vaccinated and satisfying the following:

- (1) The animal must have been at least three (3) months of age at the time of vaccination.
- (2) At least thirty (30) days have elapsed since the initial vaccination.
- (3) Not more than thirty-six months have elapsed since the most recent vaccination.

Dangerous Dog. A dog that:

- (1) Makes an unprovoked attack on a person that causes bodily injury and occurs in a place other than an enclosure in which the dog was being kept and that was reasonably certain to prevent the dog from leaving the enclosure on its own; or

(2) Commits unprovoked acts in a place other than an enclosure in which the dog was being kept and that was reasonably certain to prevent the dog from leaving the dog enclosure on its own, and those acts cause a person to reasonably believe that the dog will attack and cause bodily injury to that person.

Department. The police department of the city.

Exotic animal. An exotic animal is any animal that is not indigenous to the state of Texas. Exotic animals include the following: feral hog, Russian boar, aoudad sheep, axis deer, elk, elk hybrids, sika deer, fallow deer, red deer, and blackbuck and nilgai antelope.

Exotic fowl. An exotic fowl is any avian species not indigenous to the state of Texas. Exotic fowl include the following: guineas, peacocks, ratites, emu, ostrich, rhea, and cassowary.

Exposed to Rabies. An animal has been exposed to rabies if it has been bitten by any other animal or if it has been in contact with any animal known to be, or suspected of being infected with rabies.

Euthanize. To cause death of an animal by a method which:

- (1) Rapidly produces unconsciousness and death without visible evidence of pain or distress; or
- (2) Utilizes anesthesia produced by an agent that causes painless loss of consciousness, and death following such loss of consciousness.

Including. The term including is not a term of limitation. It means "including but not limited to."

Kennel. A place where animals are bred and boarded that has been approved by the animal control officer.

License. A document issued by the officer or any other employee of the city that shows that the owner is entitled to keep an animal as required by this chapter. The term license includes the term permit.

Livestock. Livestock means cattle, horses, mules, asses, sheep, goats, llamas, alpacas, exotic livestock, hogs, and miniature versions of same, unless otherwise defined.

Officer. Any animal warden or animal quarantine investigator employed by the city police department.

Owner. Any person who owns, harbors, handles, keeps or causes or permits to be harbored, handled, or kept, or has in his care, an animal or bird on or about his premises.

Person. The word "person" shall extend and be applied to associations, corporations, firms, partnerships and bodies politic and corporate as well as to individuals.

Pet Shelter. A facility that is approved to keep and care for animals by the animal control officer. The facility houses homeless, lost or abandoned animals: primarily a large variety of dogs and cats. The animals are kept at the shelter until they are either reclaimed by an owner, adopted by a new owner, placed with another organization, or if necessary, euthanized.

Public Nuisance. Any act, condition, or thing existing, done, or in being within the city, or within the city's extraterritorial jurisdiction, which endangers the public peace, property, health and safety of the citizens of the City. [Sec. 8.101 of Code of Ordinances].

Secure Enclosure. A fenced area or structure that is:

- (1) Locked;
- (2) Capable of preventing the entry of the general public, including children;
- (3) Capable of preventing the escape or release of a dog;
- (4) Clearly marked as containing a dangerous dog; and
- (5) In conformance with the requirements for enclosures established by the animal control officer.

Tag. A small identifying mark

Vaccination. Inoculation of an animal with a vaccine that is licensed by the United States Department of Agriculture, and which is administered by a veterinarian for the purpose of immunizing the animal against rabies.

Veterinarian. A doctor of veterinary medicine who holds a valid license to practice his profession.

Wild animal. Any animal that is not tame or domesticated.

ARTICLE 2.400 KEEPING LIVESTOCK AND EXOTIC ANIMALS

Sec. 2.401 Leaving Stock Unhitched

It is unlawful for any person to leave standing any livestock on a public street or alley within the city.

Sec. 2.402 Hitching Stock on Sidewalks

It is unlawful for any person to hitch or tie any livestock to a shade tree, fence or house on or along any sidewalk in the city.

Sec. 2.403 Restrictions on Keeping Horses

- (a) No person shall keep a horse on any premises if:
 - (1) the overall area within which the horse is kept is less than one acre for each horse kept,
 - (2) the premises are unsanitary, or
 - (3) the premises where the horses are kept are a public nuisance as determined by a proceeding in Municipal Court initiated by the issuance of a citation or summons.
- (b) The manure and debris incident to the maintenance and care of horses shall be scraped from the floor and raked from pens or areas with such frequency as to prevent the same from serving as breeding places for insects and form emitting noxious odors. The manure and debris scraped or raked, as provided above, shall immediately be collected and either placed and kept in a waterproof and insect proof container until removed from the premises. The inside walls, ceilings, roosts, and floors of the structure in which the horses are housed shall be treated and kept treated with effective material manufactured and sold for the control of flies, mites, and lice and applied according to the manufacturer's directions. (Ordinance 1194 approved 5-3-16)
- (c) Horses on less than one acre for each horse as of January 1, 2018 may receive a grandfathered status on the license with the City by March 1, 2018. No additional horses shall be allowed on less than one acre for each horse.

Sec. 2.404.1 Keeping Swine Prohibited

No person shall keep swine within the city.

Sec. 2.404.2 Restrictions on Keeping Goats and Sheep

No person shall keep goats or sheep on any premises if:

- (1) the overall area within which the goat or sheep is kept is less than one acre for each goat or sheep kept,
- (2) the premises are unsanitary, or

(3) the premises where the goats or sheep are kept are a public nuisance as determined by a proceeding in Municipal Court initiated by the issuance of a citation or summons.

Sec. 2.404.3 Restriction on Keeping Fowl

No person shall keep more than six (6) female fowl per acre:

- (1) Fowl shall be kept in a coop behind a solid fenced backyard;
- (2) The premises where the fowl are kept shall not be unsanitary; and
- (3) The premises where the fowl are kept shall not be a public nuisance as determined by a proceeding in Municipal Court initiated by the issuance of a citation or summons.

Sec. 2.404.4 Keeping Roosters Prohibited

No person shall keep within the city any male chickens/roosters. Male chickens/roosters existing as of January 1, 2018 are grandfathered. No additional male chickens/roosters are allowed to remain within the city.

Sec. 2.405 Permit Required for Exotic Animals

No person shall keep within the city, any wild animal, exotic animal, or exotic bird, warm-or-cold-blooded (not including caged pet rodents, caged pet birds and animals in aquariums) unless a permit is obtained from the animal control officer in accordance with the provisions in this chapter.

Sec. 2.406 Application to Keep Exotic Animals Fee

Application for any permit required in Section 2.405 shall be made in writing to the animal control officer, accompanied by payment determined by city council, to pay part of the cost of executing this article and is not to be prorated or refunded. The application shall state the name and residence of the applicant, the location of the premises where the animal or bird is to be kept, the number and kind of such animals or birds, and the kind of enclosure within which they are to be kept.

Sec. 2.407 Renewal, Amendment of Permit to Keep Exotic Animals

The permit required by Section 2.405 shall be renewed annually by October 31st each year, accompanied by payment of a fee established by City Council. If ownership of the place in which the animal is kept is changed, the permit may be changed accordingly upon written verified application and payment of a fee established by City Council for amending the permit.

Sec. 2.408 Findings Prerequisite to Permit for Exotic Animals

(a) The animal control officer shall determine, by inspection or otherwise, whether the keeping of exotic animals as proposed is in violation of any law or ordinance, and whether the keeping of exotic animals will constitute a public nuisance. In making this determination, the animal control officer shall consider the following factors and be guided by the following standards:

- (1) The area of the premises on which the animals are to be kept,
- (2) Whether the keeping of animals will endanger the public health or cause orders or noises offensive to persons of ordinary sensibilities residing in the vicinity, and
- (3) Whether the keeping of such animals considering all the circumstances, is likely to endanger persons or property.

(b) The animal control officer shall verify the information in the application and shall issue or refuse the permit accordingly. The permit may include reasonable conditions determined by the animal control officer to be necessary to prevent a public nuisance, such as the number and kind of animals to be kept thereon. All conditions of a permit are subject to review and revision by the animal control officer.

Sec. 2.409 Suspension, Revocation, Alteration of Permit

After reasonable notice and opportunity to be heard, the animal control officer may suspend or revoke any permit issued under Section 2.405 for violation of this chapter by the permittee. After issuing a permit, the animal control officer may add conditions or restrictions to the permit if investigation indicates any changes since the original permit was issued.

Sec. 2.410 Sanitation

- (a) All animals and birds (except dogs, cats, caged pet rodents, caged pet birds, fowl and rabbits the keeping of which is otherwise regulated herein) shall be kept in a secure pen or enclosure which shall not be less than one hundred (100) feet from any inhabited dwelling (except that of the owner or person keeping such animals or birds) or any hotel, apartment house, tenement house, hospital, church or school.
- (b) Fowl and rabbits shall be kept in a secure pen or enclosure that is at least 30 feet from any inhabited dwelling that is not the owner's dwelling, or any hotel, apartment houses, tenement houses, hospital, church or school; provided, the pen or enclosure may be within 20 feet of such buildings if separated therefrom by a public alley and by a solid fence or wall at least six feet high between the pen or enclosure and the alley; and provided, further, homing pigeons may be released from the pen or enclosure for the purpose of supervised flights.
- (c) The word "kept" as used in this section does not prevent the temporary removal of the animal or bird from the pen for any normal use or purpose. In the case of animals for which a permit is issued, the animal control officer may waive the requirements as to distance from dwellings or other buildings if keeping the animal in a dwelling or close by will not endanger the public health or create a public nuisance.
- (d) The owner or person in possession of the pen or enclosure must keep it in such a manner as not to give off odors offensive to persons residing in the vicinity, or to breed or attract flies, mosquitoes, or other noxious insects, or in any manner to endanger the public health or create a public nuisance.

(e) All persons keeping such animals and birds must comply with the following regulations.

- (1) Manure and droppings must be removed from pens, stables, yards, cages and other enclosures at least twice weekly and handled or disposed of in such a manner as to keep the premises free of any nuisance.
- (2) Mound storage of droppings or manure between such removals will only be permitted under such conditions as to protect against the breeding of flies and to prevent migration of fly larvae (maggots) into the surrounding soil.
- (3) Feed troughs may be provided for the feeding of vegetables, meat scraps, or garbage and such feeding must be done only in containers or on an impervious platform.
- (4) Watering troughs or tanks may be provided that will be equipped with adequate facilities for draining the overflow, as to prevent the breeding of flies, mosquitoes, or other insets.
- (5) No rancid material may be allowed to accumulate on the premises, and all such material used as feed that is unconsumed must be removed daily and disposed of by burial or other means approved by the animal control officer.

(f) For the purpose of enforcing this article, the animal control officer must make inspections of all places where animals or birds are kept; and the making of an application for or the issuing of any permit under this article constitutes consent for entry and inspection of the officer or his or her appointed agent(s) at all reasonable times.

Sec. 2.411 Exceptions to Permit Requirements and Exceptions to Restrictions

The permit requirements of this article do not apply to animals kept for scientific purposes by any educational or scientific institution, nor to animals belonging to a licensed circus or animal shows exhibited in the city temporarily, nor to animals or birds kept by the city for exhibition in a public park or zoo, nor to the animals kept at the G. Rollie White Complex or Veterinary Clinics, nor to animals kept for the purpose of 4-H/FFA youth programs. Such animals or birds, however, shall be kept as not to constitute a public nuisance or a danger to the public health or safety of any person, or group of persons within the city.

Sec. 2.412 Importation of Certain Animals

(a) The following animals, should not be used as a domestic pet within the city limits:

- (1) Skunk.
- (2) Fox.
- (3) Raccoon.
- (4) Ringtail.
- (5) Coyote.

- (6) Bobcat.
- (7) Marten.

(b) These animals may be imported if they are designed for a research institute or public display as in zoos or organized entertainment units or Independent School Districts.

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that all proper notices have been sent as required by City Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, based upon the evidence presented, the City Council finds that the Property is in violation of the ordinances regarding substandard structures under Section 3.207 of the City of Brady Code of Ordinances (Dangerous Premises); and

WHEREAS, the property owner, Josephine Medrano, did/did not appear at the hearing; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the structure is unoccupied; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds based on the evidence presented at the hearing that the structure contains nuisance conditions that constitute a hazard to the health, safety and welfare of the citizens and are likely to endanger persons and property; and

WHEREAS, the City Council takes notice of and incorporates all evidence presented, including photographs and the issuance of notices, for its consideration of this matter and incorporates the same into the body of this Order for all purposes; and

WHEREAS, based upon the evidence presented, the City Council finds that the Property is in violation of the Dangerous Premises Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the structure is dilapidated, substandard and/or unfit for human habitation, constitutes a hazard to the health, safety and welfare of the citizens and likely to endanger persons and property.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRADY THAT:

- (1) The foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted by the City Council and made a part hereof for all purposes and findings of fact.

(2) The structure located at 607 E. 2nd, Brady, Texas, Brady, Texas satisfies one or more of the substandard and dangerous conditions set forth in Section 3.204 of the Brady Code of Ordinances (Dangerous Premises). Specifically, Subsections, (1) The building or structure is liable to partially or fully collapse, (4) The foundation or the vertical or horizontal supporting members are twenty-five percent or more damaged or deteriorated (a portion of the structure only), (7) The structure of any part thereof has been damaged by fire, water, earthquake, wind, vandalism, or other cause to such an extent that it has become dangerous to the public, health, safety and welfare, (10) The structure, because of its condition, is unsafe, unsanitary, or dangerous to the health, safety or general welfare of the city's citizens including all conditions conducive to the harboring of rats or mice or other disease carrying animals or insects reasonably calculated to spread disease, (12) The structure is unsafe, unsanitary or dangerous to the health, safety and general welfare of the city's citizens due to a nuisance that constitutes an unsanitary condition on property as defined in Chapter 8 of the city code, of Section 3.207 of the Code of Ordinances have been violated. Therefore, the City is authorized to demolish the building under Section 3.210 of the City Code of Ordinances

(3) The owner is hereby ordered to demolish the structure located at 607 E. 2nd, Brady, Texas by no later than ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, which is March 18, 2018; and

(4) This property will be inspected for compliance with this order on March 18, 2018. If the owner fails to demolish and remove the building before March 18, 2018, the City will demolish and remove the building and assess the expenses against the lot, tract, or parcel of land or the premises upon which such expense was incurred.

It is specifically determined that the recitals in this order are incorporated by reference as findings of fact and that the meeting that the City Council passed this order was open to the public, and that the public notice of the time, place, and purpose of the meeting was given as required by the Texas Open Meetings Act.

- (10) The structure, because of its condition, is unsafe, unsanitary, or dangerous to the health, safety or general welfare of the city's citizens including all conditions conducive to the harboring of rats or mice or other disease carrying animals or insects reasonably calculated to spread disease.
- (11) The structure is unsafe, unsanitary or dangerous to the health, safety and general welfare of the city's citizens due to failure to comply with any provision in Chapter 13 of the city code ("Utilities").
- (12) The structure is unsafe, unsanitary or dangerous to the health, safety and general welfare of the city's citizens due to a nuisance that constitutes an unsanitary condition on property as defined in Section 8.106 of the city code.

WHEREAS, based upon the evidence presented, the City Council finds that the Property is in violation of the ordinances regarding substandard structures under Section 3.207 of the City of Brady Code of Ordinances (Dangerous Premises); and

WHEREAS, the property owner, Linda Stewart, did/did not appear at the hearing; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the structure is unoccupied; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds based on the evidence presented at the hearing that the structure contains nuisance conditions that constitute a hazard to the health, safety and welfare of the citizens and are likely to endanger persons and property; and

WHEREAS, the City Council takes notice of and incorporates all evidence presented, including photographs and the issuance of notices, for its consideration of this matter and incorporates the same into the body of this Order for all purposes; and

Action taken:

October 2, 2017 – The structure was inspected and pictures were taken to determine if this was a dangerous premise. Kim Davee, Code Enforcement Officer, has determined the buildings do meet the standards of a dilapidated/dangerous premises. A “Do not Enter” sign was posted on the property along with the Notice of Public Hearing.

October 2, 2017 – A public hearing notice was sent via certified mail to the property owner at the address on file with the McCulloch County Appraisal District.

October 2, 2017 – A public hearing notice was sent to be published in the newspaper on October 5, 2017 for the public hearing.

October 17, 2017 – City Council issued Demolition Order 2018-17.

The structures at this property violate the following subsections of Section 3.207 of the Code of Ordinances:

- (7) The structure of any part thereof has been damaged by fire, water, earthquake, wind, vandalism, or other cause to such an extent that it has become dangerous to the public, health, safety and welfare.
- (8) The structure does not have adequate light, ventilation or sanitations facilities as required by the city.
- (10) The structure, because of its condition, is unsafe, unsanitary, or dangerous to the health, safety or general welfare of the city's citizens including all conditions conducive to the harboring of rats or mice or other disease carrying animals or insects reasonably calculated to spread disease.
- (11) The structure is unsafe, unsanitary or dangerous to the health, safety and general welfare of the city citizens due to failure to comply with any provision in Chapter 13 of the city code ("Utilities").
- (12) The structure is unsafe, unsanitary or dangerous to the health, safety and general welfare of the city's citizens due to a nuisance that constitutes an unsanitary condition on property as defined in Section 8.106 of the city code.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Brady, Texas, finds it in the public interest to order a special election to be held on Saturday, May 5, 2018 for a vote of the electors to abolish the $\frac{1}{4}$ sales and use tax for the BEDC Type A Corporation and adopt a $\frac{1}{4}$ cent sales and use tax to be used by a Type B EDC.

NOW THEREFORE; BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRADY, TEXAS:

SECTION ONE. The foregoing recitals are incorporated into this resolution by reference as findings of fact as if expressly set forth herein.

SECTION TWO. A special election will be held on the 5th day of May 2018 in the City of Brady, Texas. The following special election language shall be submitted to the voters of the City of Brady:

TERMINATION OF THE BRADY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION, WHICH INCLUDES THE ABOLITION OF THE ¼ CENT SALES AND USE TAX WITHIN THE CITY OF BRADY FOR THE PROMOTION AND DEVELOPMENT OF NEW AND EXPANDED BUSINESS ENTERPRISED UNDER CHAPTER 504 OF THE TEXAS LOCAL GOVERNMENT COCE (TYPE A CORPORATION); AND THE ADOPTION, IN THE PLACE OF THE ABOLISHED TAX, OF A ¼ CENT SALES AND USE TAX FOR THE PROMOTION AND DEVELOPMENT OF NEW AND EXPANDED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES AND OTHER LAWFUL PURPOSES PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 505 OF THE TEXAS LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE (TYPE B CORPORATION); ALL OF WHICH WILL RESULT IN NO NET INCREASE IN SALES AND USE TAXES COLLECTED BY THE CITY OF BRADY.

SECTION THREE. A copy of this Resolution, with such omissions authorized by law, shall serve as the Order required by the Texas Election Code and proper notice of the election. Such notice, including a Spanish translation thereof, shall be posted on the bulletin board used by the City to post notices of meetings and at City Hall not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to the date the election is to be held, and shall remain posted through election day. In addition to the foregoing, this Resolution, including a Spanish translation thereof, shall be (i) posted on election day and during early voting by personal appearance in a prominent location at each polling place; (ii) posted in three (3) public places in the boundaries of the City no later than twenty-one (21) days before the election; and (iii) posted on the City's Internet website during the twenty-one (21) days before the election; and (iii) posted on the City's Internet website during the twenty-one (21) days before the election if the City maintains an Internet website.

Notice of the election, stating in substance the contents of this Resolution and Order, shall be published one time in the English and Spanish languages, in a newspaper published within the City's territory at least ten (10) days and no more than thirty (30) days before the election and as otherwise required by the Texas Election Code and applicable law.

The City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to publish and post the required notices in the manner and for the time periods required by law.

SECTION FOUR: Early voting will be April 23, 2018 to May 1, 2018 from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday and extended hours from 7:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. on April 24, 2018 and April 26, 2018 at the City of Brady City Hall, 201 E. Main Street, Brady, Texas.

Applications for ballots by mail shall be submitted to Tina Keys, P.O. Box 351, 201 E. Main Street, City of Brady, Texas by April 24, 2018.



Utility Inspections

Chronic Code Complaints

901 Bombay – Kim Davee has contacted the owner to enforce Section 3.1506(c)(2) of the Code of Ordinances which states “An owner shall provide and maintain in operating condition a toilet connected to a water source and to a public sewer, where available, in each structure intended for human habitation.” A 1st Notice of Violation was mailed certified on October 27, 2017. Mr. Malmstrom, owner, made contact to inquire what needs to be done. He was informed that he needs to connect utilities to be in compliance. Kim Davee contacted the owner December 19, 2017. He has been ill but says he has contacted a plumber and as soon as possible he will get started with repairs. No new developments.

204/206 S Walnut – A citation was issued on January 2nd.

6th and S Blackburn – Owner cannot be found.

502 W 2nd – Demolition Order #2016-10 was issued for property owner to demolish on November 7, 2017. City Council will evaluate for compliance on February 20, 2018.

201 W 6th – Demolition Order 2018-16 was issued for property owner to demolish this property on October 17, 2017. Wendy Rubio has said that they were already planning on demolishing the property but they wanted the wood. She has been informed that if she does not demolish the house by January 15, 2018, the city will demolish.

1403 S College – The property owner has made contact with the code office. He says he is planning to get the repairs started the beginning of February.

1006 Boudinotz – A citation was issued to the estate owner. Just waiting for appearance in Court.

801 North Grant – The owner did not appear in Court for December.

200 East White – Two travel trailers have been placed on the property. The owner says they were not given permission to be there. He works out of town but will be back in a few weeks. He will make sure the trailers are gone when he does return. The occupants cannot be contacted to give a citation. A complaint will be filed with the court by code enforcement and the occupants will have to answer to the judge. UPDATE: The owner was issued a citation on January 3, 2018.

1007 South Mesquite – Property has been abandoned. A citation has been issued to the homeowner for high weeds and grass but they cannot be found. Mail is returned with no forwarding address.

612 North High – Citation was issued. The structure is going on the February demolition list.

1707 Marlow – The property has high weeds and grass. The building is falling apart. I did make contact with the owner who said she and her husband would be down here by the end of the year to mow and secure the structure. The structure is going on the February demolition list.

1701 South Bradley – The appraisal district is showing returned mail as of November 2014. It has junk and unsightly matter and high weeds and grass. Owner cannot be found.
