The City Council of the City of Brady, Texas met in a Work Session Meeting on Tuesday May 4, 2021 at 4:00 pm with Mayor Anthony Groves presiding in person. Council Members present were Jane Huffman, Jeffrey Sutton, Jay May, Larry Land and Missi Elliston. City staff present were City Manager Dennis Jobe, Deputy City Manager Erin Corbell, Public Works Director Steven Miller, Finance Director Lisa McElrath, Police Chief Steve Thomas, Fire Chief Lloyd Perrin, and City Secretary Tina Keys.

1. CALL TO ORDER, ROLL CALL & CERTIFICATION OF A QUORUM

Mayor Groves called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. Council quorum was certified.

2. Review/discuss: Payroll Information

This item was not discussed

3. Review/discuss: New Fire / EMS Building – Status Report

Dennis Jobe and Chief Perrin talked about the increasing prices for building materials. Dennis Jobe said the best location would be the old hospital vacant lot. Council Member Elliston said she thought the best solution would be to renovate the police department and buildings behind. Erin Corbell said at another meeting other council members thought another location would be better and went on to say there has never been a consensus. Council Member Ellison said she thinks we should renovate what we already have and it's taking care of 2 issues at once. The police department needs work too. Chief Perrin said it's not big enough. Chief Perrin said we would need both lots. Dennis Jobe said we could take the old plans that we have and take to the architect and get some costs to see what it would take to do combine both fire and PD. Council Member Sutton would like costs using the hospital grounds. Dennis Jobe said we would check into figures to remodel. He said we already have figures using the old hospital grounds. Chief Perrin said it makes more sense to use the old hospital lot. Perrin said we would also have to excavate the lot next to the police station. Chief Thomas said he knows the fire department has been around longer and is in much worse shape but they are rapidly closing in the gap. He would be appreciative of whatever the council decides. Council Member Huffman said most towns our size do not have a paid fire dept and they have a small EMS run by the City or the hospital. She does not like the idea of getting rid of our paid fire department, but when you look at the numbers it would be the right decision. She's fearful when we start talking about millions of dollars to do these projects, she's fearful of what might happen. Other new council members coming in could take away fire, police, whatever they want. She went on to say we need to be cautious moving forward. Our community is at a breaking point and Brady has a small population that pays for everything. All the empty buildings look like poor decisions are being made. Council Member Elliston has said people have told her we don't need a police department. Council Member Elliston said she agrees with Council Member Huffman. "If we want to keep our paid fire department and police department, we're going to have to do a lot of due diligence. Mayor Groves said the people are still going to have to pay. The overhead of only one department is pretty small. If we took away the police department the sheriff's department doesn't have to keep the focus on the City. Mayor Groves thinks we have a strong enough argument to keep police and fire both. Mayor Groves thinks we can look at federal money that can help us. Mayor Groves said "this is the opportunity to get those things done." Mayor Groves asked what the advantages and disadvantage would be of the police and fire departments being in the same space. Chief Perrin said there are great advantages of working together. He has always worked where police and fire are right next to each other. He has always worked side by side with PD. Council Member Land said to the old buildings that around town and asked about the old Super S building. Chief Perrin said the building wouldn't work. They've already looked at it. The lot would work. Dennis Jobe said we can

look at putting both at fire and police together or do fire station by itself. Council Member May asked if the old Super S was built up for offices and living quarters, with the bays separate, is there room. Perrin said yes. Council Member May asked if it can be done. Perrin said yes. Council Member Huffman said even if you gutted the whole inside, it is a huge metal building. Why would we not consider something like that. Chief Perrin asked about hiring a grant writer. Mayor Groves said he would advise council to walk through the old Super S building and look to see what's there. They determined it's not a building they would want to use when the county and city looked at it. It has lots of problems. Mayor Groves said there is a reason why it sits there with nobody doing anything with it. He went on to say the county would probably be happy to let us look at it and happy to sell it to us. Council Member Huffman would like a second opinion on getting rid of or donating the old cafeteria and would like to look at getting rid of other city owned properties. Council Member Sutton asked about using the old cafeteria for a police building. Chief Thomas said he has looked at it before and wondered about using it. Council Member Huffman said we should go look at it. Mayor Groves asked Chief Perrin if he could put a fire station anywhere in the city, where would you put it. Perrin said the old hospital. Chief Thomas said he sees a lot advantages working with the fire dept. At a recent LEPC meeting they talked about those things. If money wasn't an issue, he would prefer to be with the fire department. But he can go either way. Mayor Groves said we take a look at the old cafeteria and see what we think, it's not mandatory that the two departments be together, but there are advantages. Council members need to look inside the old Super S then go on to the next step. Chief Thomas needs to look at the old cafeteria.

Council took a break at 4:58 and resumed session at 5:13

Council Member Land said he believes this town could have a bright light shining on it and how we show it is important. Dennis Jobe thinks it would be the easiest and cheapest to move the police department to the old cafeteria. He is not in favor of the old Super S. Jobe also thinks we need to look at remodeling the old EMS station for the fire department. Mayor Groves asked Chief Perrin to write down the 4 or 5 "must haves" for the facility and what is really important so we keep our perspective straight. Perrin said they have to have an EMS supply room, a room for extractors and dryers. You can't have bunker gear cleaning supplies in the fire station. They have 5 people on duty at a time so adequate sleeping quarters and bathroom facilities. He and Jobe were just looking at the basics. They were mainly looking at bays to keep vehicles out of the weather. They took some to the service center during the freeze. The problem with the old building is it's literally falling apart. He will make a list.

Lisa handed out a draft calendar of budget events. She was hoping to line out what days in July Council is available to conduct workshops. Council agreed to meet from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on July 13th and July 15th and from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. on July 20th

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRADY, TEXAS TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE OF TEXAS THROUGH THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR THE TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF FOUR-LANE US HIGHWAY 87 IN BRADY FROM MEMORY LANE AT RICHARDS PARK TO THE COURTHOUSE SQUARE, ALONG WITH TWO-LANE RANCH ROAD 714, AND TWO-LANE US HIGHWAY 190/AND HIGHWAY 377 AROUND THE COURTHOUSE SQUARE ON SATURDAY, JULY 3, 2021 FROM APPROXIMATELY 10:00 A.M. TO 11:00 A.M. FOR THE 94th ANNUAL JULY JUBILEE PARADE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Brady in cooperation with the State of Texas for the safety and convenience of the traveling public request temporary closure of four lane US Highway 87 in Brady from Memory Lane at Richards Park to the courthouse square, along with two-lane Ranch Road 714, and two-lane US Highway 190/and Highway 377 around the courthouse square on Saturday, July 3, 2021 from approximately 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. for the 94th Annual July Jubilee Parade; and
